solid wood furniture

From the first solid Oak three legged stool to the highly carved Chippendale pieces, solid wood has been the first choice of furniture manufacturers and little has changed today except the way we use our houses.

In the last 35 years houses have become centrally heated and during the last 20 years double glazing has become commonplace. The combination of these two home improvements have resulted in a very dry atmosphere in our houses. Lovely and comfortable for us during our cold damp winters but not much fun for our solid wood furniture.

In these conditions solid wood furniture will shrink and crack. Having pot plants in the room will increase the moisture content of the air and can help to minimise the amount of cracking.
